




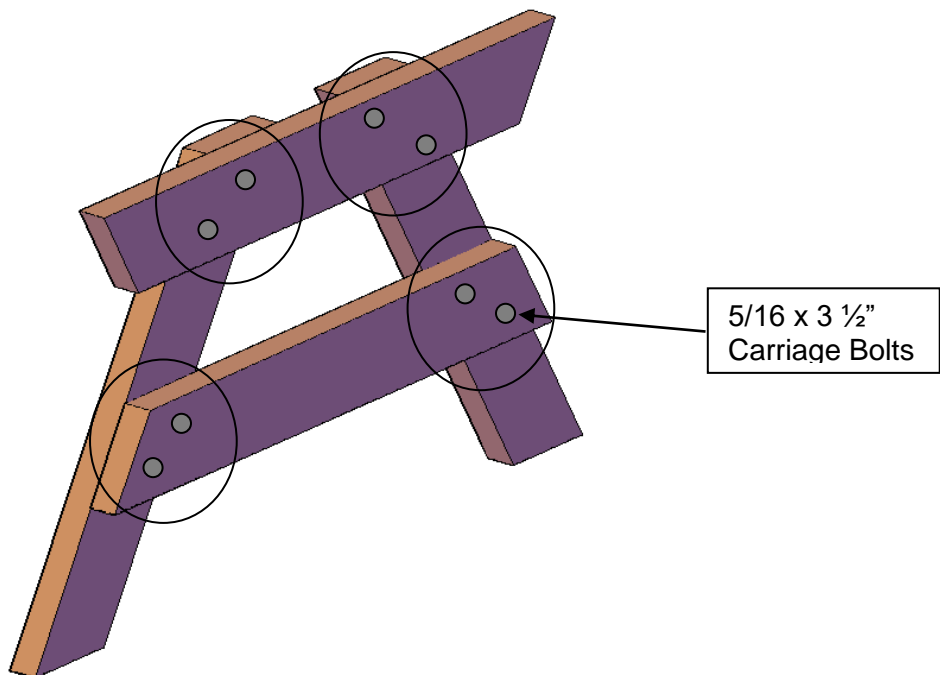
## ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

Thank you for purchasing Forever Redwood patio furniture. Forever Redwood is built by Old-Growth Again Restoration Forestry (OGA). OGA is dedicated to restoration forestry. Sales of patio furniture finance our restoration work in California redwood forestlands.

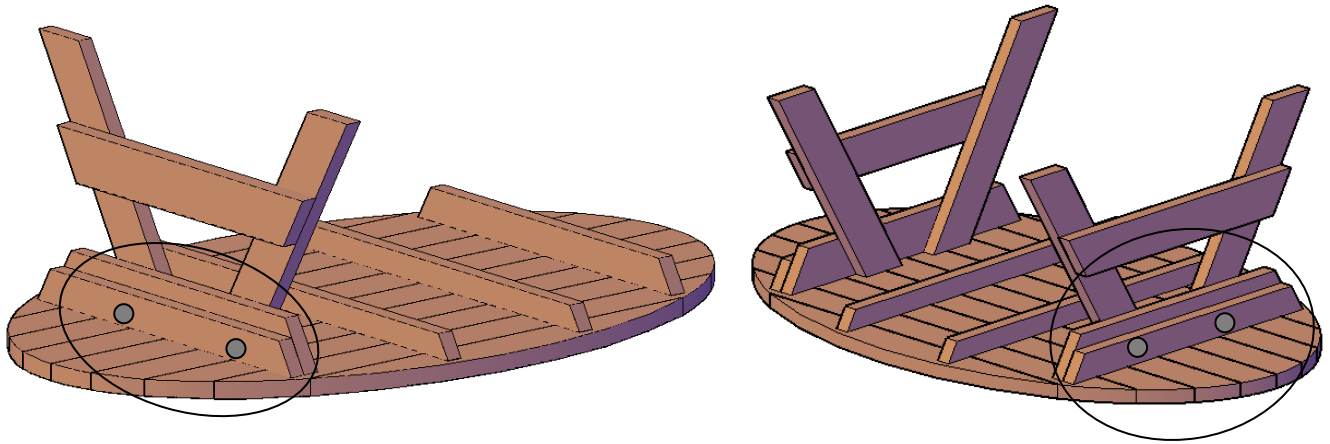
The parts that go together have the same numbers written next to the predrilled holes they attach to. Align the parts with the numbers as shown for ease of reference

**Tools required:** ½-inch ratchet and a mallet or small hammer.

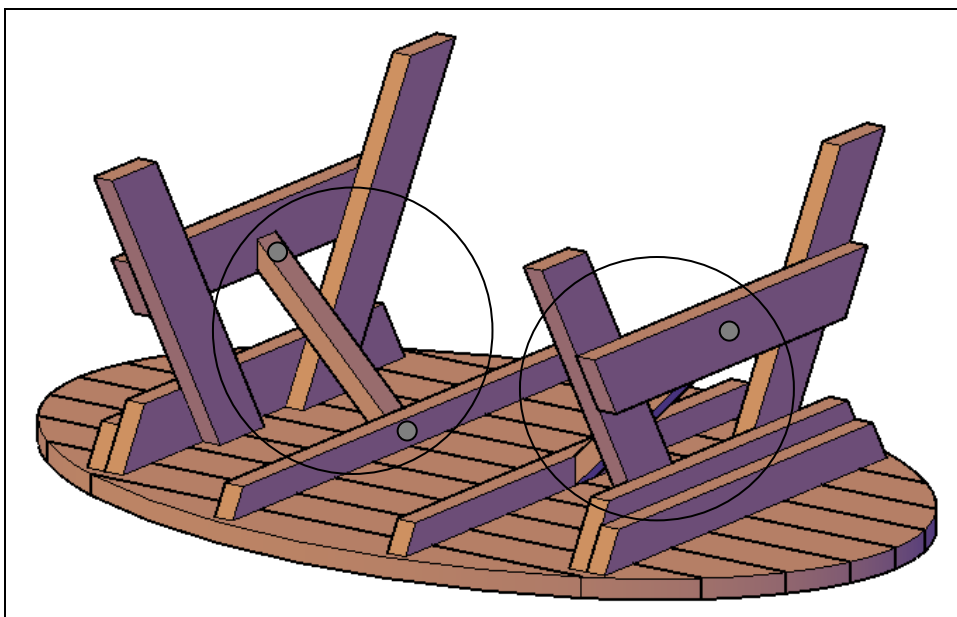
**Step 1:** Attach one long leg support and one short leg support to 2 legs as shown below. Make sure the numbers on the legs match up with both supports. Align the predrilled holes, tap the bolts all the way in (set the bolt into the wood), add a washer and tighten the nut. *Repeat this step for the other 2 legs.*



**Step 2:** Turn your tabletop upside down and attach one leg to tabletop with 2 carriage bolts, washers and nuts. Match up the numbers on the leg to the numbers on the tabletop's underside. Orient the leg so that it slopes outward as shown. Align the leg to the predrilled holes, tap the bolts all the way in (set the bolt into the wood), add a washer and tighten the nut. Make sure you are attaching the correct side. Insert washer, nut and tighten with ½ inch ratchet. Do not over tighten or you'll crush the redwood and weaken the table's structural strength. *Repeat the leg attachment with the other leg as shown.*



**Step 3:** Attach diagonal supports to short leg support and tabletop with two carriage bolts, washers and nuts. Repeat this step for other diagonal support. Make sure the numbers written on the supports match up with numbers on legs.



Carefully turn the table around. Be careful not to place all the weight of the table on one leg – the table is very heavy and can damage the point where the leg attaches if too much stress is placed on that point.
